
VALENTINE READING CHALLENGE

Saturday crafts will continue through the month of March.




Library2go oregon digital library consortium



The Book Thief

by Markus Zusak



Set during World War II in Germany, this is the story of Liesel Meminger, a foster girl living outside of Munich. Liesel scratches out a meager existence for herself by stealing when she encounters something she can't resist – books. With the help of her accordion-playing foster father, she learns to read and shares her stolen books with her neighbors. This is an unforgettable story about the ability of books to feed the soul.
