


SPRING READING CHALLENGE

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QUILT DOCUMENTATION DAY




The Oregon Quilt Project will hold a documentation day at the Hermiston Public Library on Monday, April 23 from 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. A 30 minute appointment must be scheduled by calling the library at 541-567-2882. Each person may bring 2 quilts. There is a \$10 charge for each item.

The Oregon Quilt Project is an all volunteer organization that identifies and documents quilts and quilters in Oregon to preserve the information for future generations. A documentation consists of two parts: a history of the quilt and its maker, and a detailed physical examination of the quilt. Each quilt is assigned a registration number that is recorded with the quilt project archives. If the owner agrees, the quilt will be registered with the Quilt Index at Michigan State University which already has more than 50,000 quilts from across the United States on file.


