 and Fridays at 10:15 a.m.

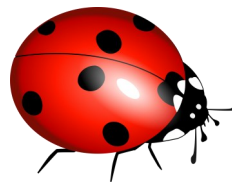
Help your preschooler get ready to read. Join the library for a fun, interactive, early literacy program designed for children from 3 to 6 years of age.

## MAY CHILDREN'S EVENTS

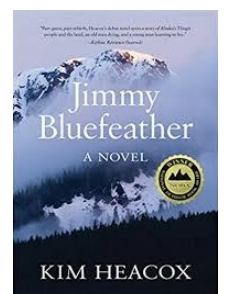

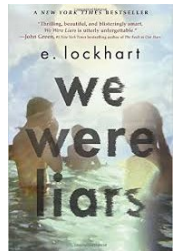
