"THE SWORD IN THE STONE"



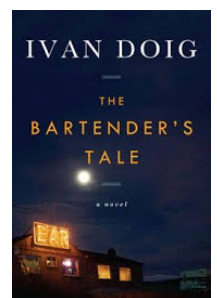
The Traveling Lantern Theatre Company will perform *The Sword in the Stone* on Monday, November 13 at 5:00 p.m.

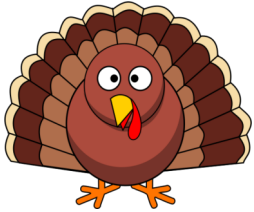

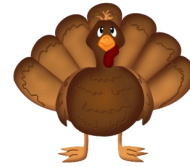
The library has started adding new titles to Library2Go that are for Hermiston patrons only. There will be shorter wait times for popular books by having these titles available. This month's purchases are:

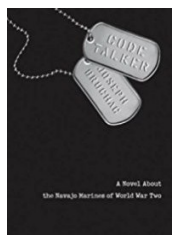
